Workman Arts is a multidisciplinary arts organization that promotes a greater understanding of mental health and addiction issues through creation and presentation.

We support artists with lived experience through free art training programs, public presentation opportunities and partnerships with the broader arts community.

WHAT WE DO

Free Art Training Courses: Multidisciplinary courses delivered by professional instructors with lived experience to artists with lived experience.

Rendezvous with Madness Festival: The first and largest mental health and the arts festival in the world that runs annually each fall.

Being Scene Exhibition: Runs annually each spring and presents work from artists with lived experience. Artists receive 100% of the art sales revenue.

Bruised Years Choir: A weekly choir made up of 25 artists with lived experience that performs at various events throughout the GTA.

Art Sales and Rental Program: 100% of sales revenue goes back to artists.

ART CART at CAMH: Artists with lived experience provide arts programming to patients in units.

OUR ARTISTS

We call our artists *members*. To become a member artist, individuals must have an existing art practice and identify as having lived experience with mental health and/or addiction issues. Member artists are as different from each other as their artistic creations. They vary in age ethnicity, education, work experience, goals and aspirations.
